Virtual Classroom Experience - San Ramon Only

CALBO has invested in production resources to ensure your virtual experience is second to none. Registrants may use their unique link to enter their virtual classroom any time after 7:30am for full-day courses and morning half day courses, or 12:00pm for afternoon half day courses.

Each course is taught live by a skilled and knowledgeable subject matter expert in front of a live audience. Course Materials

Monday Course Descriptions

2019 California Building Code: Means of Egress Overview - *Newly Updated*

ICC PP Course No. 27532 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27533 (0.6 CEUs) - Online AIA Course No. 12: 2019 (6 LU|HSWs)



This course explains basic exiting requirements of the 2019 California Building Code: Chapter 10 as well as the general requirements and explanation of the three-part means of egress system. Attendees learn practical methods of reviewing and inspecting egress systems. Permit technicians, building and fire plan reviewers, inspectors and anyone interested in learning more about egress are encouraged to attend. This course provides clarifications included in the 2019 Code Changes from the California State Fire Marshal's adoption of CBC/CFC Chapter 10 and CCR Title 19.

2019 CBC Chapter 11A: Privately-Funded Multi-Family Dwelling Accessibility

ICC PP Course No. 22612 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27539 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 35: 2019 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course provides attendees with a working understanding of the adaptable housing requirements for privately-funded multi-family dwellings in California. The course covers selected scoping and technical provisions with an emphasis on understanding the practical applicability of the requirements. Discussion and lecture assist users of the code with inspections and plan reviews of multi-family dwelling unit construction. The course meets the following continuing educational requirements: (1) HSC requirements for building department personnel, (2) BPC requirements for CA Licensed Architects, (3) AIA CES HSW Learning Units for AIA members, (4) Title 21 requirements for Certified Access.

Field and Virtual Inspections of SolarPhotovoltaic and Energy Storage Systems - *New*

ICC PP Course No. 28091 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person

ICC PP Course No. 28092 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 21: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course covers the elements required to perform field and virtual code-compliance inspections of residential and commercial solar photovoltaic (PV) systems, including structural mounting, fire service access and electrical aspects needed for a code-compliant installation. Attendees learn how to confirm that the submitted plans were properly followed and recognize the common field mistakes that installers make with solar PV systems. A checklist is provided to help guide the inspector through the review process. Energy storage systems (ESS) are also covered as these systems are commonly included with or added to PV systems. As solar PV and ESS are constantly evolving, this course updates enforcement on the latest codes and inspection procedures that impact equipment installation.

Marijuana Regulation and Enforcement in California - *New*

ICC PP Course No. 28093 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 28094 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 22: 2021 (6 LUs)



With most commercial cannabis licensing programs being administered by community development departments, this important course covers aspects of cannabis licensing program management, including zoning considerations, revenue, and enforcement. This course delves into the evolving area of law and local government management that is marijuana cultivation and how it relates to community development, building safety, and code enforcement professionals. Attendees learn the history of marijuana law fees and tax considerations and marijuana grow elements encountered by the building-safety profession. A review of recent examples of indoor and outdoor cultivation techniques that inspectors may encounter is presented as well as local ordinances that jurisdictions have adopted to manage their programs. Attendees leave better educated on the current marijuana cultivation landscape with practical information that they can put to use right away.

Swimming Pools and Spas - Newly Updated

ICC PP Course No. 23888 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27541 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 11: 200 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course covers the electrical requirements in the California Electrical Code, Article 680, for permanently installed swimming pools, storable swimming pools, spas, hot tubs and fountains. Topics covered include wiring methods, grounding and bonding, lighting and receptacle locations, motors and GFCI requirements. Also, students learn an overview of the plumbing, mechanical and pool barrier requirements. Discussion also includes suction fittings and pumps, heaters, luminaires, pool access (fencing, gates, pool covers, and pool alarms) and location of various equipment. This information is essential for both installers and inspectors to ensure life safety in and around these wet locations where the combination of water, electricity and personnel demand a hazard-free experience.

AM Half Day: 2019 California Plumbing Code: **Inspection Fundamentals**

ICC PP Course No. 23879 (0.3 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 28081 (0.3 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 3: 2020 (3 LUs)



This course is a comprehensive overview and a step-by-step process of performing all plumbing inspections. The course covers the basics of the 2019 California Plumbing Code along with code requirements ranging from the underground to the final inspection. This course helps the inspector identify and prioritize plumbing corrections. Inspection fundamentals are also discussed, including both residential and commercial plumbing applications. After the course, attendees will have more confidence while performing inspections on waste, vent, water and gas systems. In addition, inspectors will be more familiar with the plumbing code and where to locate specific code sections.

PM Half Day: 2019 California Mechanical Code: Inspection Fundamentals

ICC PP Course No. 23878 (0.3 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 28082 (0.3 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 2: 2020 (3 LUs)

This course covers the mechanical inspection process on residential and commercial projects from first to final inspection, while identifying what should be looked for at each stage to avoid costly and/or burdensome project delays. Rather than an in-depth code review, this course covers the most common corrections found in the field, their relevant code sections and a break down navigating the code book by its chapters. This simplified yet systematic approach to mechanical inspection also touches on concurring code considerations, such as Zoning and Energy Code requirements.

2019 California Residential Code: Significant Changes

ICC PP Course No. 20355 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27536 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 12: 2019 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course examines the significant revisions to the latest California Residential Code (CRC). The course is conducted in a workshop format with the instructor and attendees participating in active discussions of the revisions. The course highlights those areas that have been revised from the 2016 CRC with other code topics always welcomed. Building officials, architects, designers, engineers, plans examiners, field inspectors and counter technicians are encouraged to attend.

Hot Topics in the 2019 CBC Chapter 11A Accessibility - *New*

ICC PP Course No. (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. (0.6 CEUs) - Online AIA Course No. 25: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)



This course provides an overview of hot topics related to the 2019 California Building Code Chapter 11A, starting with history, scoping fundamentals, and examples. Covered multifamily dwelling units are discussed, as well as existing buildings, site impracticalities, multistory dwellings, parking facilities, accessible routes, common use facilities, and dwelling unit features. Within covered dwelling units, hot topics focuses on doors and "primary entrances." Building officials, accessibility plan reviewers, accessibility inspectors, designers, architects, and contractors are encouraged to attend.

Residential Plan Review

ICC PP Course No. 23881 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27542 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 5: 2020 (6 LUs)

This course covers the basic requirements that should be found in a set of plans for residential construction, including site plan, floor plan, roof plan, elevations, sections, energy, framing, foundation and detailing. Whether it is a new home, an accessory dwelling unit, a room addition, a patio enclosure or a garage conversion, this course highlights typical issues and special requirements encountered based on the different types of projects. Attendees learn how information from each of the different trades comes together on the plans. For additions, remodels and conversions, attendees are also asked to consider the existing conditions and how the proposed construction affects the existing dwelling or structure. Upon completion of the course, attendees will understand the main concepts of what to look for when performing a residential plan review.

Safety Assessment Program: Evaluator and Coordinator Training

ICC PP Course No. 27530 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27531 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 11: 2019 (6 LU|HSWs)


The primary focus of this course is to train building inspectors, architects, and civil engineers to perform field evaluations of buildings and other infrastructure for damage along with how to rate the safety significance of that damage. SAP inspectors will be prepared for disaster assessment and the required documentation. This training is also approved by the Federal Department of Homeland Security for homeland security grant funding and provides local governmental representatives with information on how to estimate the local needs for evaluators and other resources that may be needed in response to a local event, how to request the needed resources, how to effectively manage those resources, and how to manage the information gathered by those resources. Up-to-date materials published by the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) are provided.

Wednesday Course Descriptions

Advanced Overview for Permit Technicians

ICC PP Course No. 23886 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27537 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

This course is designed for experienced permit technicians seeking to elevate their building department knowledge and skills. An overview of state laws and the granting of authority are discussed to give context for the role of building departments.



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2019 CBC Chapter 11B Accessibility in Public Buildings, Public Accommodations and Commercial Buildings: History, Use and Updates

ICC PP Course No. 20357 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27535 (0.6 CEUs) - Online AIA Course No. 13: 2019 (6 LU|HSWs)

This course provides attendees with a working understanding of the disabled-access provisions contained in the 2019 California Building Code, presenting on selected administrative, scoping and updated technical requirements. Supporting documents (ASTM, ANSI, Guidelines, Best Practices, etc.), tools of the trade, and inspection techniques are explored throughout the course. Local jurisdictional staff (building department, public works, parks and recreations, etc.), architects, designers, contractors, and business owners/managers are encouraged to attend. The following continuing education requirements are met: (1) HSC requirements for building department personnel, (2) BPC requirements for CA Licensed Architects, (3) AIA CES HSW Learning Units for AIA members, (4) Title 21 requirements for Certified Access Specialist (CASp).

2019 California Electrical Code: Residential and Commercial Inspection Procedures

ICC PP Course No. 23885 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27540 (0.6 CEUs) - Online AIA Course No. 9: 2020 (6 LU|HSWs)



This course covers residential and commercial inspection procedures for compliance with the California Electrical Code, Green Code and Energy Code, including but not limited to: residential - receptacle layout, AFCI, GFCI requirements, required circuits, wiring methods, services, subpanels and grounding for new and existing installations for inside and outside. Other subjects are covered, including commercial – wiring methods, wall and t-bar inspections, sizing boxes, box fill, de-rating conductors, expansion fittings (when required), 3-phase for WYE/DELTA panels and transformers. Attendees are encouraged to engage in class discussions and are provided with examples to assist in learning the subject matter.

Hot Topics in the 2019 California Building Code - Newly Updated

ICC PP Course No. 27526 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person

ICC PP Course No. 27527 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 9: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course provides an in-depth review of important code provisions in the 2019 California Building Code (CBC). Topics include occupied roof decks, egress and fire-resistance rated assemblies. Diagrams and examples are used to assist with the understanding and practical enforcement of the code. The CBC mid-cycle code amendments effective July 1, 2021 are also discussed. This course is conducted in a workshop format with the instructor and attendees participating in active discussions. Building officials, architects, designers, engineers, plans examiners, field inspectors and counter technicians are encouraged to attend. The course is appropriate for experienced and not-so-experienced users of the CBC.

Understanding Apartment Buildings and Mixed Use Development from Plan Review to Inspection - *New*

ICC PP Course No. 28095 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person

ICC PP Course No. 28096 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 23: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course presents the concept of mixed-use development from a code compliance perspective, with a focus on provisions of the California Building Code (CBC) Section 508 as well as a focus on Chapter 11-Accessibility. Discussion includes accessory occupancies, occupancy classification, allowable building areas, required separation of occupancies, incidental uses, and special provisions. Those who want to learn more about or need a refresher in mixed-use projects and the special requirements applicable to buildings containing two or more occupancy classifications are encouraged to attend. This course is designed for building officials, plan reviewers, inspectors, senior permit technicians and architects.

2019 California Building Code: Special Building Types and Features - *New*

ICC PP Course No. 28097 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 28098 (0.6 CEUs) - Online AIA Course No. 24: 2021 (6 LU|HSWs)



This course focuses on the application of the 2019 California Building Code (CBC) to special types of buildings, such as high-rise and underground buildings, open and covered malls, and motor vehicle facilities. Learn the new related regulations for construction projects, such as occupied roofs, tall wood buildings, automated parking garages, and special amusement buildings containing puzzle rooms. This course is designed for plan reviewers and inspectors seeking to enhance their knowledge and skills in applying the CBC to unusual and complex structures.

Analyzing Access Law, Standards and Application for California Building Departments - *Newly Updated*

ICC PP Course No. 28078 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 28079 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 20: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)

This course is designed for public works engineers, building officials, senior plan reviewers, senior inspectors, and architects. It presents the structure of law and application with respect to access standards for projects built with private and public funds. Attendees learn the following: the hierarchy and relationship of constitutional, statutory and regulatory laws associated with accessibility; how access civil rights law, statutory law and case law relate to construction standards, permit processing and code enforcement in California. It is designed as an informational aid, not a legal requirement, to assist public officials in the administration of state and local public policy as well as improving their ability to comply with AB 1379 by enhancing their outreach and education capabilities related to the CASp program.

Hot Topics in the 2019 CBC Chapter 11B Accessibility - New

ICC PP Course No. 28665 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person

ICC PP Course No. 28666 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 26: 2021 (6 LU | HSWs)

Circulation paths, accessible routes, path of travel, doors, and gates are all components required to access an area, to get into existing and new buildings and facilities. This course reviews hot topics of 2019 CBC Chapter 11B, including routes from the public way, parking, and public transportation, through the entry, and within the building. Onsite parking, electric vehicle charging stations, and detectable warnings are covered. Scoping and technical code provisions related to these and baby changing tables, adult changing facilities, bottle filling stations, sales and service counters, and benches are also discussed. Building officials, accessibility plan reviewers, accessibility inspectors, designers, architects, and contractors are encouraged to attend.

California Accessory Dwelling Units of Today and Tomorrow: What We've Seen and What's to Come - Newly Updated

ICC PP Course No. 27652 (0.6 CEUs) - In-Person ICC PP Course No. 27653 (0.6 CEUs) - Online

AIA Course No. 13: 2021 (6 LU|HSWs)



This course reviews the recent history of and emerging trends in attached and detached accessory structures, such as accessory dwelling units (second unit dwellings) (ADUs), junior accessory dwelling units (JADUs), garage conversions, granny flats, and much more. Conventional construction requirements and prescriptive structural and non-structural requirements for ADUs are discussed, including references to the 2019 California Residential Code. Building officials, building inspectors, permit technicians and plans examiners are encouraged to attend to become familiar with the current requirements of California law related to ADUs to understand local jurisdiction authority to regulate these structures and how ADUs are distinguishable from other types of new alternative housing styles. This course provides an overview of the ADU framework of today and tomorrow that continues to evolve, including resources and checklist examples created by building departments throughout California.

Understanding Load Path: Unraveling the Complicated - New

The overall strength of a building is a function of all the components – roof, walls, floors, and foundation – working together as a unit. As building layouts and geometry get more complicated, the load path becomes harder to track. This course provides a practical, top-to-bottom overview of the gravity and lateral load path for wood-framed structures and how to apply the simple principles to a more complicated geometry. Topics of discussion include load path continuity, connection design and considerations, and common framing mistakes to look for in the field. The course also includes a discussion of the 2019 California Residential Code (CRC) wall-bracing requirements for wood-framed residential structures and implications of the Title 24 code updates to the overall building structure, including advanced framing and high-performance walls and attics.
